



Directions for your Sandwich Book Report:

Do all of your writing on scrap paper first. Have an adult read it before you copy it onto the parts of the sandwich.

- The top piece of bread is where you write the title of the book, the author, the illustrator (if there is one) and your name.
- Describe the setting (or one of the settings) of the story on the tomato.
- On the lettuce tell what happened in the story. Focus on telling me about the problem and the solution.
- Tell me about the main character on the slice of meat.
- Most books have at least one part that makes you smile or laugh. Tell about that part on the cheese.
- Some books make you feel like crying. If there was a sad part, tell about it on the onion. If no part made you sad, tell me about a part that was a bit scary, or a time when one character was sweet to another.
- On the last slice of bread tell me about how the book was written by the author. Was the author one of the characters? Could the author tell what people were thinking? Did the writing make you feel like you were watching a movie? Did you think about the story even when you weren't reading it? Then give the book a rating.

Cut out the parts of the sandwich, make your sandwich, and then put it back in the Ziploc bag.
